

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-6-4-B

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING HUNTSVILLE TOWN CEMETERY PLOT FEES

WHEREAS: Huntsville Town desires to keep the cemetery self-sustaining financially and to increase the Perpetual Care Fund, to accomplish this in part, so that the cemetery will not become a burden to the taxpayers of this town.

NOW THEREFORE: be it resolved that the sale of cemetery plots will be \$500.00 per plot for Huntsville Town resident (person living within the Huntsville Town Boundary), and the internment fee will also be set at \$500.00 for the opening and closing of each grave site for Huntsville Town residents. (Persons living within the Huntsville Town Boundary).

NOW THEREFORE: be it resolved that the sale of cemetery plots will be \$1,500.00 per plot for non-residents (anyone living within the 84317 zip code area). The internment fee will be set at \$700.00 for the opening and closing of each grave site for non-residents (anyone living within the 84317 zip code area).

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: No cemetery plots will be sold to anyone living outside the 84317 zip code area, without approval from the Huntsville Town Council.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: There is a six (6) plot maximum purchase limit, unless approved by the Huntsville Town Council.

NOW THEREFORE: be it resolved that three (3) cremation urn burials are allowed in one burial plot.

NOW THEREFORE: be it resolved that the fee for internment of a cremation burial for a Huntsville Town resident (person living within the Huntsville Town Boundary) will be set at \$200.00. The fee for internment of a cremation burial for non-residents (anyone living within the 84317 zip code area), will be set at \$300.00, for a 12" X 12" X 24" opening.

NOW THEREFORE: two (2) infants (vault length of 22" or less) per burial plot is allowed. The fee for internment for Town residents (Persons living within the Huntsville Town Boundary) will be set at \$200.00. The fee for internment for a non-resident (anyone living within the 84317 zip code area) will be set at \$300.00 for a 12" X 12" X 24" opening.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Huntsville Town will now offer a buy-back program for those who no longer wish to keep their plots. The purchase price will be \$400 per plot.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED THAT: any purchase of a plot or transfer of a plot from a Huntsville Town resident (Persons living within the Huntsville Town Boundary) to Non-Resident (anyone living within the 84317 zip code area), will incur a \$1,000.00 name change fee. The sale of a plot from a resident to a non-resident must be approved by the Town Council. No cemetery plots will

be sold to anyone living outside the 84317 zip code area without approval from the Town Council. Any purchase of a plot or transfer of a plot from a Town resident to another Town resident will incur a \$25.00 fee.


NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: a plot may be transferred from a plot owner to a relative who is a non-resident for a \$25 transfer fee, after the plot has been owned for a minimum of 10 years from the date of purchase. Proof of relations will be required; such as, a birth certificate.

NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: if a need for disinterment arises the fee will be set at \$2,000.00. Proper documentation will be required.

If the grantee or holder of a plot or parcel in the Huntsville Town cemetery has not used the plot or parcels for a burial for more than sixty (60) years from date of purchase, and during the time and has not given to Huntsville Town a written notice of claim or interest in the plots or parcels shall be prima facie evidence that the grantee or holder has abandoned the plots or parcels. Reference Title 11.4.G.

This Resolution was passed and adopted by the Huntsville Town Council, State of Utah, this 4th day of June, 2020.
